From the Desk of the Principal

Athletics Carnival

We are still making plans to run the athletics carnival on September 18. Due to the COVID-19 restrictions placed on schools, this year we will have to implement a number of changes. Most notably, parents are not permitted to attend the event. We have also decided, in the interest of planning, to run the carnival at school on the bottom oval to ensure we are able to proceed if further restrictions are placed on community Additionally, there will be no district, events. regional or state carnivals, so competition times will not progress beyond the school. At present, the only event we will have difficultly running to official standards is the 200m race because we cannot fit a full circular track on our playing field. Field events will be run throughout the term and the Athletics carnival will be a track only day and novelty events.

Cross Country

The Cross Country Carnival will be run at school on September 25. Unfortunately, parents are not permitted to attend this event either.

3 Way Conferences

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, face-to-face conferences will be replaced with phone meetings or Zoom meetings, except in exceptional circumstances. Parents are encouraged to make a phone appointment over the coming weeks <u>or</u> schedule a Zoom meeting in Week 9. Zoom meetings will need to be kept to a strict timeline to ensure no overlap of meetings occurs. Details regarding how to book a Zoom meeting will be forthcoming.

Kindergarten Orientation

Due to COVID-19 restrictions we are not at this stage permitted to hold our Kindergarten Orientation program. Individual exceptions will be made for a small number of students with complex planning arrangements to attend individually with a single parent. We are currently planning alternative virtual arrangements to support our new students and their families.

Assembly Videos

Due to COVID-19 restrictions we are not permitted to have assemblies that run longer than 15 min or have an audience. Therefore, we will be videoing students receiving their awards and posting the videos on our website.
