From the Desk of the Principal

Presentation Day Assembly

This year we will be making a number of changes to the format of the Presentation Day assembly to ensure compliance with current COVID safe guidelines for schools hosting end-of-year award presentations. Please note the following:

- Presentation Day will be held on Wednesday
 9 December.
- There will be two (2) assemblies held on the day (K-2 and 3-6) to reduce numbers and allow us to comply with social distancing requirements.
- Attendance at the Presentation Day assemblies will strictly be by invitation only.
- Only families of students receiving awards will be offered invitations.
- A maximum of two (2) invitations per family will be provided.
- Invitations cannot be shared across different families to ensure we adhere to the 1.5 m spacing of non-household members. For example, if you only require one invitation, you cannot give your second invitation to another family.
- Each assembly requires its own invitation. That is, if you have a child receiving awards in both the K-2 and the 3-6 assembly, you will receive two (2) separate invitations.
- All attendees will have to sign-in on the day and provide contact details. These details will need to be kept at the school for a further 28 days (please note that all contact details will be kept confidential and stored securely).
- All attendees, including staff and students must be well and free of any cold or flu-like symptoms.
- There will not be any food or beverage provided. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own water bottle.
- A photo/video space will be kept clear to allow parents/carers to capture images while their child is receiving an award.

- There will not be any special guests or dignitaries attending, except for a representative from Colo High School to present the scholarship award.
- There will not be any singing of the National Anthem or school song
- Sanitiser will be made available upon entry and at key points around the school
- Masks wearing is optional

Year 6 Graduation, Arch and Bell Ring

This year we have removed the presentation of Year 6 graduation certificates from the Presentation Day assembly. Instead, we have included it in the celebrations that occur in the last hour of the last day of Year 6. Students will be presented with their graduation certificates in the hall prior to commencing their journey through the arch to ring the bell for the last time. Please note the following:

- Parents/carers of Year 6 students are invited to attend the Year 6 graduation, arch and bell ring.
- Year 6 students will be presented with their graduation certificates in the hall prior to commencing the arch.
- The student arch will be modified to comply with COVID safe guidelines (no hand touching, appropriate spacing of individuals and cohort groups).
- Parents/carers will be required to maintain appropriate social distancing.
- Careful consideration must be given to the risks posed by close physical contact, hugs, signing of shirts, sharing of pens and other related activities. We encourage students, staff and parents/carers to practice appropriate social distancing and hygiene measures.
- Careful consideration must also be shown when taking group photos. Please position all members appropriately in group shots. Please also note that images posted online of group photos can potentially demonstrate a breach of COVID safe practices.

Planning is underway for the new school year. In order for us to plan effectively we need to know anticipated new enrolments and leavers.






'Drop-off and Pick-up' area safety tips



Safety tips for drivers using a 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area


- Always drop-off or pick-up your child from the designated area, following the school's procedures.
- Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area.
- Make sure children use the footpath-side door when getting in and out of a car.
- Make sure the hand brake is applied when the vehicle is stationery.
- Never double park.
- Never park across a pedestrian crossing.
- Never undertake a U-turn in close proximity to the school.

Safety tips for students

- Stay buckled up until the vehicle has stopped in the 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area.
- Make sure your school bag and other items are in a safe position, eg on the floor.
- Be ready to get out of the car with your belongings when the car has stopped and you have unbuckled your seatbelt.
- Always get in and out of the backseat of the vehicle through the safety door the rear footpath-side door.

Safety tips for volunteer supervisors

- Wear a conspicuous, identifying safety item such as a fluoro vest, sash and/or hat.
- Assist students to exit and enter each vehicle in turn in the 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area, while remaining on the footpath.
- Do not attempt to direct traffic and do not enter the road environment.

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now <u>apply</u> online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.


Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

How to Handrub?
