KISS AND DROP ZONE

In the last school newsletter we reminded families of the rules around the Kiss and Drop Zone in the afternoon. Please see the dot points below. These were provided to us by the Council Ranger who visited the school last year. We do not own or control the Kiss and Drop Zone. There are road laws which govern the use of such areas. This is simply a reminder of the information we as a school have been provided with.

- You must remain inside your vehicle. If you need to exit your vehicle, please park on the other side of the road and use the Green Zone to pick up your children.
- The engine must remain on at all times.
- You may only remain in the Kiss and Drop Zone for 3 minutes.

We are also reminding families to use the pedestrian crossing when approaching the school. Many families are not using the crossing, which is setting a bad example for our students and can be very dangerous at times.

I will be monitoring the Kiss and Drop Zone over the next few weeks to provide a gentle reminder to all families. Please remember that these are not our rules/laws and we don't like to create unnecessary conflict. However, the safety of our students, staff and community is always our first consideration.

ATTENDANCE

Earlier in the year we announced an initiative to encourage school attendance. As part of this initiative there were going to be incentives for students who attend school more than 90% of the time. With the current COVID situation and floods having a significant impact on student attendance this term, we have decided to postpone implementation until Term 2. More information will be provided then.
