STAFF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Last Thursday Mrs Grech and I attended a SoLaR (Science of Learning and Reading) meeting at Comleroy Road Public School. These meetings are designed for Assistant Principals and Principals to develop a deep understanding of the science that informs teaching and learning and develop networks between schools to improve practice throughout the network of schools.

Last week we discussed the research underpinning the new English Syllabus and its alignment to the work we are undertaking across the network. We looked at Explicit Teaching, the Simple View of Reading and Scarborough's Reading Rope during this PL session. This was a fantastic opportunity for discussion, collaboration and support for all schools to ensure we implement best practice for the academic benefit of all students at each of the 15 schools involved.

PARENT INFORMATION SESSION

If you would like to learn more about the Science of Reading mentioned above, as well as the approaches we are taking to teaching at Grose View Public School, we are holding a second session of the Parent Information Session we ran earlier in the term. 
SYNERGY DANCE FESTIVAL

ATTENDANCE


The graph below shows the Attendance Rate as at Week 8 for each grade in the school. Most grades across the school have an attendance rate around 80%. If a student attends school at a rate of 80% over the course of the year, they will miss eight weeks of school in total. We need this attendance rate as close to 100% as possible. Well done to our Year 2 families with the highest percentage at 94.2% this week.



Our new attendance rewards begin this term, with students receiving acknowledgement for attendance of greater than 90% attendance or perfect attendance for the term. We will hold our first Attendance Assembly in Week 10 where students will receive awards, attendance pencils and share an attendance cake. How exciting!

Parents/carers will receive an invitation later in the term to attend and share in the celebrations with students.

REPORTING - SEMESTER 1 2022

The Department of Education's requirements for reporting to parents/carers K-12 have been amended to support schools through impacts caused by COVID-19 during Semester 1 2022. In response, we have amended our report template for Semester 1. This semester's report template will include a comment for both English and Mathematics. An achievement and effort scale will be included for: English, Mathematics, Creative Arts, Human Society and its Environment (including History and/or Geography), Personal Development, Health and Physical Education, Library; and Science and Technology.

The information included in the reports will focus on individual student learning progress and support parents/carers to understand how their child is going. The reports will also include information for what can be done to support their learning growth.

For students in Kindergarten, the achievement scale uses the language 'working towards', 'working at' and 'working beyond' grade level. For

students in Years 1-6, the achievement scale uses the language 'Outstanding', 'High', 'Sound', 'Basic' and 'Limited'. For Kindergarten, a competent student working well in the classroom would be expected to achieve a grading of 'Working At' in each Key Learning Area. For Years 1-6, a competent student working well in the classroom would be expected to achieve a grading of 'Sound' in each Key Learning Area. A description of the scales has been included below for your reference.

Our school reports your child's progress with written reports twice a year. Interviews are conducted with all families in Term 3, and by request at other times of the year. Reports are due to be sent home in Week 10.

Stages 1-3 Achievement Scale (Years 1-6)

Outstanding (A) – The student has an extensive knowledge and understanding of the content and can readily apply this knowledge. In addition, the student has achieved a very high level of competence in the processes and skills and can apply these skills to new situations. Students at this level are working significantly beyond stage expectations.

High (B) - The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations. Students at this level are working beyond stage expectations.

Sound (C) - The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills. <u>Students at this level are working at stage expectations</u>.

Basic (D) – The student has a basic knowledge and understanding of the content and has achieved a basic level of competence in the processes and skills. Students at this level are working below stage expectations.

Limited (E) - The student has an elementary knowledge and understanding in few areas of the content and has achieved very limited competence in some of the processes and skills. Students at this level are working significantly below stage expectations.

Kindergarten Achievement Scale

Working Beyond - The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations.

Students at this level are working beyond stage expectations.

Working At – The student has a sound knowledge and understanding of the main areas of content and has achieved an adequate level of competence in the processes and skills. <u>Students</u> at this level are working at stage expectations.

Working Towards - The student has a thorough knowledge and understanding of the content and a high level of competence in the processes and skills. In addition, the student is able to apply this knowledge and these skills to most situations. Students at this level are working beyond stage expectations.

From your app, go into Settings cog in the top left corner of the dashboard screen, then into App Version. (See image below.)




I am on Version 3 or 4
